High Risk Maternal Child Health (HRMCH)

High Risk Maternal Child Health is a free, voluntary program that provides homebased services to families/caregivers of children (birth to eighteen years) and high risk pregnant women.

GOALS

- Increase knowledge of medical and health needs for infants and children
- Improve health outcomes through adequate understanding of necessary medications, compliance, treatment and to prevent hospitalization
- Improve birth outcomes and decrease neonatal mortality
- Increase knowledge of appropriate parenting and childcare

• Increase knowledge of community resources available for families

Substance Exposed Infants (SEI)

Substance Exposed Infants is a free, voluntary program which provides home-based Public Health Nurse (PHN) services to families, or caregivers with substance exposed infants/children. Services are provided to infants and children from birth to age 3 years who were exposed to drugs before birth, and are at risk for developmental delays, abuse, neglect, and failure to thrive.

GOAL

Improve health and developmental outcomes for substance-exposed infants/children.



Case Management Services for HRMCH and SFI Include:

Assessment

Comprehensive assessment of infant/ child physical conditions, growth and development, environment and resource needs. Assess caregiver's knowledge and understanding of child's condition, treatment, medical care and follow up. Assessment of caregiver's parenting skills. Nutritional assessment. Evaluate for food, clothing and shelter. Assess family's psychosocial status.

Education

- Education regarding specific health conditions
- Appropriate growth and development
- Parenting skills and childcare issues
- Appropriate nutrition and feeding
- Preventive health measures
- Available community resources
- Problem solving skills

Coordination of services

Refer to appropriate community resources/ agencies. Assist and advocate to facilitate access to needed services. Coordinate with medical providers and agencies.
