What is the meaning of the different colors of the Homeland Security Advisory System?

There are five Threat Conditions, each identified by a description and corresponding color. From lowest to highest, the levels and colors are:

- Low Risk = Green
- Guarded Risk = Blue
- Elevated Risk = Yellow
- High Risk = Orange
- Severe Risk = Red

The higher the Threat Condition, the greater the risk of a terrorist attack. Each color represents an appropriate set of Protective Measures which are specific steps an organization should take to reduce its vulnerability and increase its ability to respond during a period of heightened alert. The HSA's website contains information from the Red Cross that describes what you should do under each threat level.
