- Made progress on **72% of Activities**. (n=8)





# Percent of Up-to-Date Vaccinated Persons in Stanislaus County


As of 2019, 41% of 13-yr-olds completed HPV vaccination series; 62% have received one dose.

4.8% of Stanislaus County fully protected against COVID-19.

Vaccines are pivotal tools in curbing the spread and impact of communicable diseases.





# Housing & Homeless Action Plan

Accurately identify homeless population and align plans and strategies across county

- Integration of AWG into Community System of Care (CSOC)
  - Asset mapping

Address early life factors that place youth at risk for homelessness; engage local systems to prevent youth homelessness

- Partners include SCOE and YNC
- Revisiting activities related to Adverse Childhood Event (ACE) informed practices

Expand and provide housing services and coordinated approaches to increase housing stability

- Policy-level work with Housing Stanislaus initiative and Stanislaus Homeless Alliance (SHA)
- Cal AIM efforts related to behavioral health and increased supports for people experiencing homelessness

- Unavailability of incentives


### Area of improvement

## Expectations for this CHI cycle


- Partners and staff showing interest and commitment to the work


